Travel requirements to enter Canada

It is important that all travelers familiarize themselves with the rules that apply before they travel to Canada. This applies to entry restrictions, registration requirements, testing, quarantine rules and requirements regarding documentation for exemption.

It is also important to be aware that the rules may change at short notice and that the traveler is responsible for ensuring they are up-to-date about the rules that apply at the time of entry.

Please note that only <u>fully vaccinated people</u> are allowed to enter Canada and that the use of the <u>ArriveCAN app</u> is currently mandatory.

Also remember to have a valid <u>ETA (Electronic Travel Authorization)</u>. Since entry regulations can change at short notice depending on the public health situation, we recommend that you <u>familiarize yourself</u> with the relevant regulations.

Updated: 05.04.2022

To qualify as a fully vaccinated traveller to Canada, you must:

- Have received at least 2 doses of a vaccine accepted for travel, a mix of 2 accepted vaccines
- Or at least 1 dose of the Janssen/Johnson & Johnson vaccine
- Have received your second dose at least 14 calendar days before you enter Canada
- Have no signs or symptoms of COVID-19
- follow entry requirements
 - Upload proof of vaccination in ArriveCAN
 - Complete your ArriveCAN submission and and have ArriveCAN receipt with letter I, V, or A beside your name
 - Complete arrival test if selected


